Easter would not be complete without the colouring of Easter eggs! A traditional activity for many Orthodox and Eastern Catholic Christians. The egg itself has been known to represent the resurrection of Jesus at Easter. Often painted or dyed red to represent the blood of Christ that was shed on the cross.

There are a variety of ways to add colour to eggs during Easter. Follow these simple steps to do this activity with your family and elderly loved ones or those in your care.

Preparing Eggs

There are a couple of ways to prepare your eggs for Easter decorating. The easiest choice is to use hardboiled eggs to make them easier to handle, but depending on how it's decorated, they may not be safe to consume.

Another option is using raw eggs and blowing them out using a pin and a straw to "blow out" the insides without damaging the shell. This can be quite tricky and messy!

Egg Activity

Basic Egg Dye

 Mix one teaspoon of vinegar and 20 drops of food colouring (use more to intensify colour) in one cup of hot water in a heatproof bowl, cup, or jar deep enough to let you submerge an egg completely. To create different tints, vary the dipping time. Using tongs makes handling the eggs easy.

Design Techniques

Before dipping your eggs into the dye, consider using these tips for creating unique designs.

- Try stacking layers of rubber bands around the egg and removing them between layers of new dye to create a multi-coloured/layered look.
- Did you know you can use stickers to create designs?
 You can also use leaves, masking tape, or anything
 that can be adhered to the surface of the egg. Simply
 remove the "stickers" after applying the dye, and
 you'll find the design is all that's left behind.



Hot Cross Buns

A family favourite at Easter, these Hot Cross Buns are a perfect addition to any table!

Dough:

- 2 packages (1/2oz) active dry yeast
- 2 cups warm whole milk (110° to 115°)
- 2 large eggs, room temperature
- 1/3 cup butter, softened
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Frosting:

- 1-1/2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 4 to 6 teaspoons whole milk

- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- 6 to 7 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup dried currants
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1 large egg yolk
- 2 tablespoons water



Directions

- 1. In a small bowl, dissolve yeast in warm milk. In a large bowl, combine eggs, butter, sugar, salt, spices, yeast mixture and 3 cups flour; beat on medium speed until smooth. Stir in currants, raisins and enough remaining flour to form a soft dough (dough will be sticky).
- 2. Turn onto a floured surface; knead until dough is smooth and elastic, 6-8 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover and let rise, about 1 hour.
- 3. Punch down dough. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide and shape into 30 balls. Place 2 in. apart on greased baking sheets. Cover with kitchen towels; let rise in a warm place until doubled, 30-45 minutes. Preheat oven to 375°.
- 4. Using a sharp knife, cut a cross on top of each bun. In a small bowl, whisk egg yolk and water; brush over tops. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from pans to wire racks to cool slightly.
- 5. For the icing, in a small bowl, mix confectioners' sugar and enough milk to reach desired consistency. Pipe a cross on top of each bun. Serve warm.

SPRINGTIME BUNNY CRAFT

Create your own Spring bunny characters!



Here's what you need:


- Cardboard Rolls (paper towel or toilet paper rolls)
- Craft glue
- Scissors
- Decor Paper* or paint
- Pencil Crayons or Markers
- Design template

Instructions:

- 1. Cover each cardboard roll with decor paper (adhere with glue) or use paint to cover the outside of each roll. Let dry.
- 2. Using the template, colour and then cut out each shape you want to use (bowtie, carrot, nose, ears) for your design.
- 3. Using the glue, carefully paste each shape onto the covered cardboard roll to create a springtime bunny face and body.
- 4. Colour the grass outline green and secure in place in front of your characters.



*optional - feel free to use leftover wrapping paper, corrugated paper, craft/construction paper of various spring colours like orange, green, pink, etc. or paint/markers to decorate the cardboard roll.
